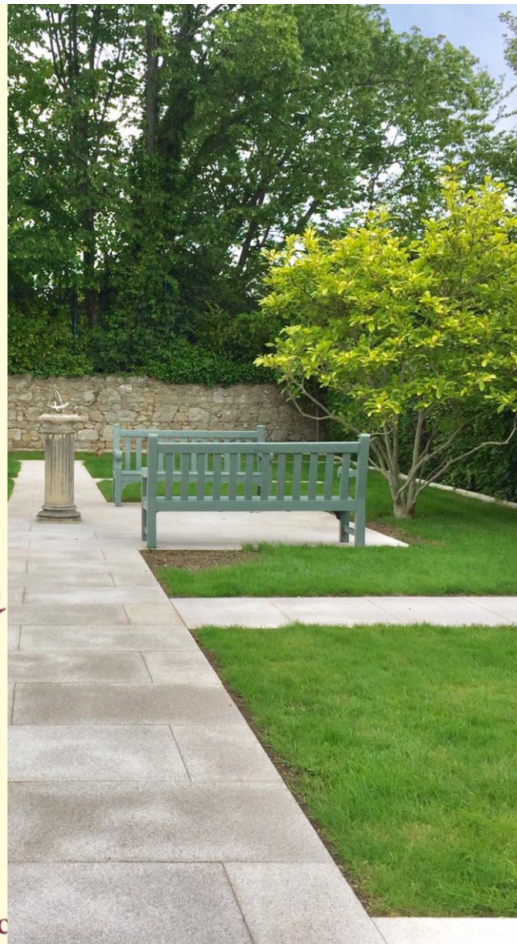




Tullow Parish Church

adjacent to the Church.



Work to improve the Remembrance Garden is now finished and hopefully you'll all agree how beautiful it looks – it is truly an oasis of peace and does justice to the memory of loved ones.

We are offering the right to the burial of cremated ashes. Burial plots, which have the capacity for two caskets, are €1,500 for parishioners and there are a limited number of plots available to non-parishioners at €2,500. Cards with full information are at the back of the church and are also being distributed to undertakers in the area. The lovely drawing on the cards of the sun dial in the Garden is by Aisling Ellis. Many thanks are due to Joyce Buckley for seeing this project through to its successful conclusion.

The Rector Writes

The General Synod of the Church of Ireland took place in Derry from 16th to 18th May. Three bills were brought to Synod and were passed by large majorities. Two were liturgical: (a) A form of Service for

Holy Communion by extension which allows Communion to be taken from a Church Service to those who may be housebound, and (b) An innovative formal Service of Prayer, Naming and Funeral in the event of a miscarriage, stillbirth or perinatal death. The third bill put in place mechanisms for the future amalgamation of the two United Dioceses of Tuam, Killala and Achonry with Limerick and Killaloe.

The Salt Path by Raynor Winn, which is set in Devon and Cornwall, is the book for the June meeting.

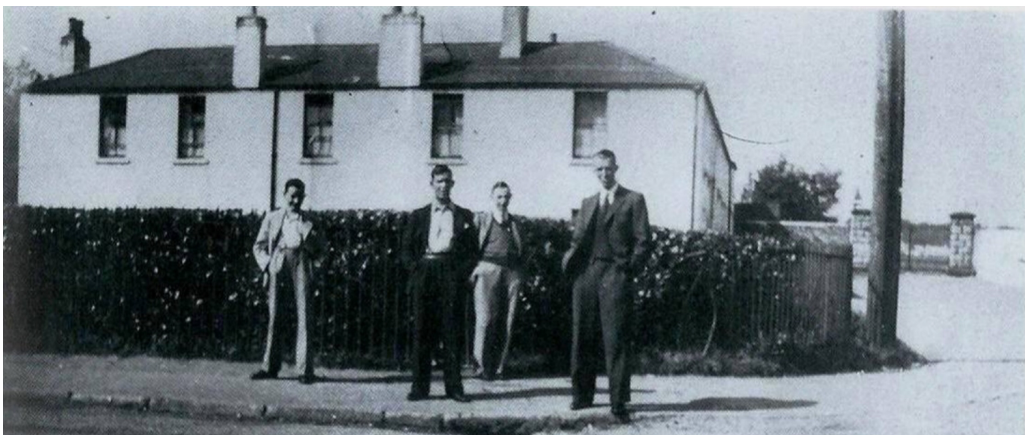
