The Rector Writes

'They shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.' Isaiah 2:4

'At the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month' the guns of World War I fell silent with the signing of the Armistice. That agreement to cease hostilities was supposed to bring an end to the war to end all wars. However, just under twenty-one years later Europe was once again at war with the commencement of World War II. That conflict ended in 1945 and with it came pledges of structures that would ensure it would never happen again. But alas, Europe is once again experiencing conflict following the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Now almost nine months into that conflict, there is little sign of a resolution as winter bites and both sides try to consolidate their positions. As we mark Remembrance Sunday this year, there has never been a better time for humanity to pledge themselves to the causes of freedom, justice and peace. Golf Classic in Aid of Irish Cancer Society





The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles.

A very different setting and storyline to *A Gentleman in Moscow* but just as enjoyable.

Set in North America in the 1950s, the book centres around two young brothers. Emmet gets early release from a Juvenile Correctional Centre due to the death of his father. He now has responsibility for his much younger brother. The two brothers have very different plans for the future. Emmet wants to go to Texas, with a view to buying derelict houses, renovating them and selling them on at a profit. Billy wants to go to California with the hope of finding their mother. Fate steps in and takes the two brothers to New York and to the start of the Lincoln Highway (which runs all the way to California).

The author has a gift of phrase and timing. An enjoyable read despite the length of the book.
