

The Rector Writes

'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!' Luke 2:14

Over recent weeks we have been bombarded with Christmas themed advertisements on radio, television and newspapers and the majority of stores have been bedecked with Christmas decorations since before Halloween. And despite a cost-of-living crisis, there is a noticeable increasedu busyness in our retail parks and centres. But why? What is it about Christmas that gets so many to lose the run of themselves? To me it is sad that it would appear that it has little or nothing to do with the actual Christmas story - the birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem. Of course, some would argue that the excitement is around the seasonal tradition of giving and receiving gifts to mark God's greatest gift to humankind of his only Son to be our Saviour. However, the spirit in which our traditional exchange of gifts is undertaken is very



conditional – we give in the expectation of receiving. When God gave his only Son, it was a free gift for everyone and all he expects in return is that we gratefully receive it. This Christmas, what will be your response to God's gift?

Christmas is also a traditional time for family gatherings. These can be happy occasions as they provide the opportunity for families who rarely get together to do so against a joyful backdrop – and especially after the 'Covid Christmases' of 2020 and 2021! However, for many, such events are tinged with sadness due to the passing of a loved one. For others, there may be a rift in family relationships and such gatherings can prove fractious, tedious and stressful. For some, it is a lonely time as they find themselves on their own with no close family support - this group also includes refugees and immigrants, which this year is much larger due to the conflict in Ukraine. For yet others, it is a very busy time as they ensure our emergency services can function. We also remember those who staff such facilities as hospitals and residential care homes. For a few. especially those who are homeless, sleeping rough and/or have dependency issues it is a time of dread and they cannot wait until the normality of the New Year to return. So, as we prepare to celebrate this Christmas, let us always be mindful of those less fortunate than ourselves.

May I take this opportunity on behalf on my family and myself to wish parishioners, families and friends a very Happy, Holy and Peaceful Christmas and a Blessed and Prosperous New Year.


Christmas is a very exciting time for little ones and, as well as the Family Service at 10.30am on Christmas Day, there are two Services which are geared especially to them.

Service of Remembrance Sunday 27th November

The first post-Covid Service of Remembrance saw a congregation of parishioners, family members of deceased parishioners and members of the local community take part in a Service to remember their loved ones. The readings, hymns and prayers were all beautifully apt and the Rector's thoughtful sermon about the stages of grief using a shipwreck analogy would have struck a chord with many of the bereaved present.

Names of the deceased relatives and friends of those present were read out and candles lit in their memory.

A poignant yet comforting Service which was enhanced by the quality of the

silence when the lights were dimmed. This special Service was much appreciated by all those present and a beautiful way to remember loved ones.

Village Phone Box

The original phone box, the longest-standing in Ireland, is located at the village crossroads directly opposite The Gables. It was originally designed and installed between 1922 and 1925. In the years following the creation of a new Department of Post & Telegraphs in 1924 the design was changed to incorporate 'telefon' at the top and 'P&T' at the base.

To protect this important structure FACE plans to totally refurbish it in 2023 to ensure its future sustainability.


Badminton Club Thursdays 8pm Parish Hall

that on the last day


when he shall come again in his glorious majesty

Appeal for Unoccupied Properties

We have been asked by Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County Councilto share the following information:

Dún Laoghaire Rathdown County Council is joining with other local authorities to lead a new appeal for offers of unoccupied properties to provide temporary homes for those fleeing war in **Ukraine**.

More than 60,000 people have arrived in Ireland from Ukraine, and most are in need of safe and secure accommodation. This new call aims to make use of unoccupied houses, apartments or holiday homes to provide much needed accommodation on a temporary basis.

The appeal is for offers of houses, apartments, or holiday homes for use as temporary accommodation for those arriving from Ukraine. Ideally, properties would be available for at least six months. Property owners can offer homes at <a href="https://doi.org/10.2016/journal.com/offers/40/2016

The local authority in which the property is located will be the point of contact for owners throughout the offer and assessment process. Owners can expect to be contacted by the local authority within 5 working days of making an offer and an assessment of the property will be carried out shortly after. In addition, the person who offers the property will be able to check the status of their offer at any stage through the website. Local authorities will also match suitable properties to Ukrainian beneficiaries and can support in agreeing licence agreement and other arrangements.
