The Rector Writes

2023 may well be remembered in this part of the world as the "summer that never was". But lest we get carried away, we have had such inclement summers in the past. However, we must not let that fact try to persuade ourselves that we are not living through a time of very worrying climate change. While we have had to protect ourselves from rain, wind and coolness, in other parts of Europe people died from heatstroke and an unprecedented number of wildfires have caused the destruction of life, ecology and property in places as widely dispersed as Europe, Hawaii and Canada. In other parts massive record volumes of rainfallhas caused extensive flooding, mudslides and again, loss of life.

As we head into our Harvest season, we are encouraged to not only be thankful for our harvest, but also engage with what we may be able to do to mitigate climate change, to protect our environment, our biodiversity and our finely balanced ecology. It is up to each one of us to do all that we can to ensure that the generations coming after us will also be able to enjoy God's creation in all its fullness. When it comes to our Church and parish life, we have taken many steps in recent

Dear John and members of the Select Vestry

It is with a heavy heart that I am writing to inform you that I will be stepping down from my position as Organist at Tullow church at the end of September. This has been a very difficult and long-pondered decision, and I know I will miss the people and the services/music so much. Tullow is an exceptionally welcoming, supportive, and friendly place – in this regard, I would like to particularly record my thanks for the support shown to me in my first couple of years in the Parish.

My reason for stepping down is simply due to wanting a little more freedom with my time, which, over the past year or two, has been consumed by my main job. I now need to reevaluate my work-life balance with due consideration for my family and being able to see them and mark occasions more frequently than is currently possible.

My final Sunday will be 17 September, as I will be attending my sister's wedding the following week. I understand that the congregation will be informed that I am leaving but I would like to depart with minimal fuss.

I wish my successor well and hope that under new direction some more people might feel open to joining the choir (perhaps!).

I'd like to pay tribute to the commitment of the choir. I am very proud that we have been able to keep chanting and hope that this will continue. Twenty years is a long time to spend with a choir, but one could not have asked for a more friendly group of people. We remember with fondness and thanks those members, and husbands and wives of current members, who are no longer with us.

I wish you, the choir and the congregation all blessings for the future and don't be surprised to see me in the second pew from the back from time to time.

Paul Says Farewell after 20 Years

Paul McNulty, our highly esteemed and multi-talented organist and choirmaster, is leaving after more than 20 years in Tullow. He has led our singing Sunday after Sunday, been the mastermind behind many years of wonderful Carols by Candlelight and has played at countless happy and not so happy occasions. His organ voluntaries at the end of the 10.30am Service on Sundays not only make us appreciate his playing talent but also ensure a sense of peace at the end of each Service.

As you will see from his resignation letter his heavy work responsibilities (he is the Head of School at the TUD Conservatoire of Music), along with his desire to spend more time with his family, have led to his decision.

It goes without saying that the whole parish will miss him but choir members will probably miss him most of all.

Here are some of their thoughts:

"First and foremost Paul is an accomplished organist, and for the last 20 years it has been an absolute joy to hear him play, especially in the last while listening to the voluntaries at the end of the Service. He will be greatly missed by the congregation but more so by the choir who are very sad that he is leaving us. We wish him well in the future."

"I will miss his dry wit and gentle Donegal accent which, by the way, was seldom raised."

"Paul has been a calming influence with the choir. He is a talented organist and we wish him well in the future."

"Paul has a lovely calm personality and is a very quietly spoken gentleman with a soft Donegal accent. He always made me feel so welcome since joining the choir 10 years ago. He has immense talent which he conceals in the comfort of his personality. I feel he will be a huge loss to Tullow after 20 years as a very loyal and dedicated church organist."

"Paul has endless patience and is so kind and helpful."

"It's difficult to put into a sentence what Paul means to me because he is brilliant in so many ways - musically he is amazing, his quick wit is second to none but it is as a friend that I appreciate him most but that won't end when he leaves us in Tullow."

"Paul's unique music making was inspiring and uplifting - an extra reason for going to church."

"We will miss you desperately!! And your Donegal wit and thanks for everything over the last 20 years x."

"We have been so very fortunate to have had Paul as organist for almost 20 years. Over that time Paul has been encouraging to all of us and very sympathetic - specifically to me who cannot even read music but loves to sing. We will all miss Paul so badly for so many things - his amazing talent but not least for his quirky sense of humour."

"Paul I am more than sad to hear you're leaving us. I hope you have a wonderful life ahead with lots of love and fond memories."

A presentation from the Parish to mark our appreciation will be made to Paul after the 10.30am Service on Sunday 17th September which will be his last day playing for us.

Thank you so much Paul - we will miss you!

Outreach - Bray Women's Refuge

"We are going to have in the order of 50,000 domestic abuse incidents happening this year" - that is a comment by the Garda Commissioner this week. When a woman eventually plucks up the courage to leave an abusive partner it is often a case of grabbing an opportunity. This may mean leaving the home, possibly with children, and having nothing but their phone and the clothes they stand in. At Bray Women's Refuge they will find a safe place and if required will be directed through the court system.

So what can Tullow parishioners do to help? Providing pyjamas for women and children is a good start, also giving toiletries, including tooth brushes and paste, for all age groups. (These may be left in the basket at the back of the church). The constant availability of tea, coffee and biscuits also helps the Refuge to provide for their clients. Any large cash donations go to assisting payment for legal fees.
