# **The Rector Writes**

November is the traditional month of remembrance as churches, cathedrals and parishes all around the country hold special Services of Remembrance. Many of these Services will be to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice with their lives while serving with armed forces fighting to oppose tyranny and in the pursuit of justice and peace. The purpose of these Services of Remembrance is to ensure we never forget the real and horrendous price that had to be paid so that we can today enjoy relative justice and peace in our part of the world. Unfortunately, as we look at the wider world of today, we find that others are not so fortunate and the mistakes of the past are being repeated.

The ongoing conflict in Ukraine resulting from Russia's invasion sees daily human tragic loss of



life, livelihoods and infrastructure. The current outbreak of conflict in the Middle East which commenced with the brutal slaughter of some 1,400 Israelis and the taking of hostages by Hamas has now seen the reported deaths of approximately 5,000 innocent Palestinian men, women and children. No matter what political views one holds, all of these killings must be totally condemned. In addition, the withholding of essential food, water, fuel and medical supplies from million of people stranded in Gaza is reprehensible and is still not being called out by many of the so-called civilised nations with the power to exert influence on this situation. Such practice was condemned in the aftermath of the World War II Jewish holocaust. but appears to being allowed to happen once more to another ethnic group before the eyes of the world. Jesus said, 'You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy." But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the taxcollectors do the same?' Matthew 5:43-46

Also, the tradition of "all Saints" and "all Souls" this month is devoted to the remembrance of those loved ones who played such a formative role on the present generation but have nowgone to their eternal reward. And it is indeed an essential part of knowing exactly who we are and where we might want to go that we should know and understand our heritage andwhere we came from. A deeper understanding and critique may also help us to avoid repeating any mistakes made in the past as mentioned in my opening comments above.

#### **Bob Willis Centenarian**

There is hardly anyone in Tullow Parish who does not know Bob Willis. Bob reached the amazing age of 100 on 1st October this year and everyone in church that Sunday sang a very loud Happy Birthday. The congregation, very appropriately, was accompanied by the Stedfast Band.

Aroundabout 1990 Bob and his late wife Elaine moved back to Dublin from Co. Wicklow. They had been active members of Newcastle Parish but upon their return the then Rector of Tullow, Cecil Hyland, called on them and invited them to join Tullow Parish. The rest, as they say, is history! Bob was elected to the Select Vestry in the mid 1990s and is still an active member who makes very pertinent and pithy contributions to every meeting.

Bob was born on Brighton Avenue in Rathgar and went to High School and then to Trinity where he studied Honours Maths. As the Auditor of the Maths Society he had to present a paper on a relevant subject. His paper so impressed Dr Roy Geary that he persuaded Bob to think about a career as an actuary. The path to becoming an actuary in those days (1945) was by completing a six year correspondence course with the UK based society.

Irish Life was one of the few companies in Ireland which employed actuaries at the time so Bob started there and, in fact, spent all his working life with Irish Life including 17 years as MD. In true modest fashion Bob maintains that he was simply in the right place at the right time!

Bob was instrumental in helping to establish actuary as a profession and was a founder member of the Society of Actuaries in Ireland. His contribution to the profession was recognised at a recent lunch to mark his birthday at which he gave what was described as a witty speech to the audience of 500 actuaries.

He qualified in 1951, saved up and married Elaine in 1953. She was from Clontarf but, while he was aware for some time of this very attractive girl, they didn't formally meet until they were both at a Presbyterian Church function. That, as the saying goes, was that, and they were together for 64 years until Elaine's death in 2018.

Bob was Vice Chancellor of Trinity College from 1985-1999 and, in 1995, was awarded an honorary Doctorate from Trinity in honour of his contribution to the university and service to the Rotunda Hospital. In 1988 he oversaw the amalgamation of four schools to become what we now know as Rathdown School. They also had a recent lunch to mark his birthday and thank him for his services.

Bob believes that communication is vitally important in all aspects of life and, after so many years on the Select Vestry he wonders if the term 'Select' may sound elitist to some ears. He appreciates that members are selected by parishioners but would prefer the term Vestry. The photos are of Bob on his 100th birthday (complete with trademark rose in his buttonhole!) being presented with a mini birthday cake as the Tullow congregation sang Happy Birthday; at one of the garden visits in 2020, doing his annual job selling Christmas cards for charity and at his graduation from Trinity in 1945 - note the gold medal!

Happy birthday Bob and thank you!

# Leopardstown Racecourse Origins. SPEAKER: - Prof. Fergus D'arcy

Professor Fergus D'Arcy, M.A., Ph.D., Fellow of the Royal Historical Society, is Professor Emeritus in modern history of University College Dublin (UCD). He lectured in UCD from 1970, was Dean of the UCD Faculty of Arts through 1992 to 2004. His publications include Terenure College, 1860-2010 (Dublin, 2010), Horses, Lords and Racing Men: the Turf Club, 1790-1990 (Kildare, 1991) and the award winning Remembering the War Dead: British Commonwealth and International War Graves in Ireland Since 1914 (Dublin, 2007). His talk will be the origins of Leopardstown Race Course.



Leopardstown Racecourse is an Irish horse-racing venue, located in 8 kilometres south of the Dublin city centre. Like the majority of Irish courses, it hosts both National Hunt and Flat racing. The course, built by Captain George Quin and modelled on Sandown Park Racecourse in England, was completed in 1888 and acquired by the Horse Racing Board of Ireland in 1967. Many important races are held here and racing takes place all year round, with about 22 meetings per year. In 1941, noted Royal Air Force pilot Hugh Verity, who flew many secret agents at night into and out of farm fields in France, force landed on the Race Course. He was interned briefly before escaping back to England. The Leopardstown Hall of Fame honours famous Irish horse racing trainers, jockeys and horses

like, Vincent O'Brien, Tom Dreaper, Pat Taaffe and Pat Eddery, Arkle, Dawn Run, Levmoss and Nijinsky.
