The Rector Writes

and the evenings getting brighter, coupled with the tentative signs of nature putting forth new life, there is that promise of hope which helps to put a spring in peoples' steps and lighten their moods. Our Church calendar for February reflects this progression of light and hope. The 1st February, the feast of St. Brigid (a saint associated with this area), officially marks the beginning of Spring on our calendars. On 2nd February we celebrate the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, also known as Candlemas. The celebration of Candlemas originated in the late fifth century as a tribute to the light of God's glory that was manifested in Christ Jesus. The earliest known observance within the Church was in the year AD 496, during the time of Pope Gelasius. In the Gospel of Luke 2:22-40, Simeon the priest and Anna the prophetess met the infant Jesus in the temple at the time of his consecration. Simeon's prophecy declared Jesus to be the Lord's salvation and "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your



people Israel." This passage continues to be the focus of the celebration on 2nd February and in many traditions, as part of the ceremony, candles are blessed, lit, and borne in a procession in celebration to Jesus being the light of the world.

Just under two weeks later, on the 14th February (unlucky for St. Valentine romantics), we enter the season of Lent. This is a season during which the themes of our readings and Services encourage us to reflect and reappraise our lives and prepare ourselves for the events of Holy Week and Easter. Ultimately, it is the message of Easter that governs our whole life and being as Christians. It is the message of Easter that makes sense of Jesus being the true light of the world. And it is the message of Easter that gives us that hope which does not disappoint – even if the chill winds of winter still blow in our direction. May we ever live in the hope and light which finds its birth in this month of February!

A fun fact: 2024 is a Leap Year with 29 days and that will give us five Thursdays. The next time we will have five Sundays in February will be 2032!

Family Carol Service 10th December

The Family Carol Service was a really lovely occasion which was followed by a sumptuous lunch in the Parish Hall very generously hosted by Sandra and Alan Rhodes. The range of food (and wine!) was amazing and the attendees showed their appreciation by contributing €635 towards the collection for the Jack and Jill Foundation.

Carols by Candlelight 17th December

This Service is one of the highlights of Christmas for many people. The beautiful familiar carols were lustily sung by the almost capacity congregation led by the choir who also demonstrated their talent by singing a couple of 'choir only' carols. The church looked so pretty and seasonal - there's something special about evening Services when it's dark outside.

Being on the Register of Vestry Members means you can have a say in what goes on in the Parish – you can elect people to the Select Vestry, contribute to any debate, vote at the annual Easter General Vestry. You can also, but ONLY if you wish, be nominated or elected to positions such as Church or Glebe

Warden or represent the Parish at diocesan level. Being a registered vestry member does NOT mean that you will be asked to do more work or contribute more time or money than if you are not registered.

The Register of Vestry Members is revised at the beginning of each year. If you would like to be on the register please contact the Rector who will send you a form but make sure you do it soon as the completed form has to be back with the Rector **before 12th February**.


The History Club's Next Public Lecture is on: TUESDAY 20TH FEBRUARY 2024

With the 6th Battalion – South County Dublin and the War of Independence 1916-1921

SPEAKER: - James Brady



James Brady is a History and Politics graduate; his main areas of research are local history and Irish political history. He lives in Dun Laoghaire.



South County Dublin was affluent, often loyal and sometimes republican. Encompassing the suburbs and outlying villages like Foxrock and Deansgrange. This talk will cover the culmination of nearly a decade of research by James into the role played by the local volunteer movements that would eventually comprise of the 6th Battalion of the Dublin Brigade, Irish Republican Army.

This talk will focus on the local area and the sometimes-unknown stories of the War of Independence that James has collected from interviews with families of the members of the 6th Battalion. It will be a new look at this period and the local impact of the events close to the area. Be sure to add this to your calendar.
