# **The Rector Writes**

I wonder if you have noticed the proliferation of courier service on our roads and streets over recent years. Amazon Prime, DPD, DHL, Fastway, just to name a few and, of course, not to forget An Post. At the end of the day, they are all merely delivery systems – a means of getting a product from a seller to a purchaser. A delivery system is not the product, but just the means to transfer a product.

As a Church, have we ever seriously considered delivery systems? As we begin the joyful Easter season when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, the Epistle to the Romans says, 'But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? (Romans 10:14). This passage paints a picture of people who need to hear the life-changing message of the risen Christ, of the Church that has been entrusted with that message, and of the fact that unless that message is delivered, then people will not know about it. As a Church, it would appear that the instinct is to delay in order to avoid upset to members. However, in John's Gospel, in an



interchange between Jesus and his disciples, we are invited to do the opposite: to reap a harvest, to get on and do it. Indeed, we are told that the fields are ripe for harvesting.'

As already mentioned, a delivery system is not the product – it is just a way of getting something from 'here to there'. The delivery systems we use to communicate the message of Easter hope are just that – a means of getting the message to those who need to hear it. The message of the risen Christ is the 'product' which remains of central importance. And as Church, our range of Church Services are one of our main delivery systems. Therefore, we have to constantly review how effective those delivery systems are – because delivery systems do matter!

May the joy and hope of the risen Christ be yours this Eastertide.

**Easter in Tullow** 




