

All that Fall - Beckett in Foxrock 2025 Saturday 29th March at 8pm Tullow Church

How many villages have a play written about them by a Nobel Laureate? That rare distinction applies to Foxrock Village. *All that Fall*, originally written as a radio play and seldom performed, features the characters and sounds of a re-imagined Brighton Road, Leopardstown Racecourse, Foxrock station and village.

A cast of eight - Geraldine Plunkett, Donncha Crowley, Michael Judd, Marcus Lamb, Paul Marron, Deirdre Monaghan, Eimear Morrissey and Matthew O'Brien will bring to life what has been called 'Beckett's best play'.

Experience this special limited capacity rare event in a unique location – the church itself where Samuel Beckett and his mother worshipped. As it is a play for radio the audience will be given blindfolds - adding to the uniqueness of the occasion.

Samuel Beckett, Nobel Laureate, was born and brought up in Foxrock and was a regular attender, along with his mother, at Tullow Church. A commemorative plaque was unveiled in 2016 by

Beckett's niece.


Come along and have your say about the future of the Parish. It does NOT mean you'll get landed with a job!

To vote at the Easter General Vestry, or be elected onto the Select Vestry you need to be on the Register of Vestry Members (see below).

# **Register of Vestry Members**

Being on the Register of Vestry Members means you can have a say in what goes on in the Parish – you can elect people to the Select Vestry, contribute to any debate, vote at the annual Easter General Vestry. You can also, but ONLY if you wish, be nominated or elected to positions such as Church or Glebe Warden or represent the Parish at diocesan level. Being a registered vestry member does NOT mean that you will be asked to do more work or contribute more time or money than if you are not registered.

In a change to previous practice, the Register of Vestry Members can be amended at any time. If you would like to be on the register please contact one of the Church Wardens - Torren Gale or Nigel Swanwick or the Rector or pick up a form at the back of the church. It's easy and it's free.


#### **NEWS**
