The Rector Writes

As we begin the month of June we are entering a time that can be extremely stressful for families especially the extended families of those undertaking state examinations. For those undertaking their Leaving Certificate, years of study and preparation are now concentrated into a couple of weeks of tests that can have a major impact of the student's future. Although some marks may be already allocated in certain subjects such as Aural and Oral components of languages, the hopes and dreams still ride on how many points can be achieved over these short weeks. It can be a time of uncertainty, anxiety, worry, self-doubtand the full gambit of negative emotions and feelings. It is a time which requires the ultimate in self-care. It is a time to ensure that every effort is made to strike a balance between rest and study. It is a time to seek calmness and peace - the calmness and peace which many try to find in the world around them, but which can only be ultimately found in God. Therefore, it is a time for candidates and their families to seek God's guidance and direction through prayer. We look forward to our Autumn sessions starting in September. Why not join us and try a new craft or bring your current project.


