

The Rector Writes

Another school year has drawn to a close, and long summer holidays now lie ahead for all those of school going age. For those who have just completed their Leaving Certificate Examinations, the seemingly endless anxious wait begins ahead of results expected on 22nd August. Hopefully this will bring clarity to candidates' future direction and enable them to realise their hopes and dreams. As our primary schools close for the summer, those in sixth class will now be looking forward to moving to their secondary school of choice in late August. It can be both an anxious and exciting time for students and families alike.

However, for most, summer is a time when they look forward to being able to take things a little easier and plan a holiday – a break away from routine. Whilst that is both welcome and necessary, it can be a difficult time for those who depend on routine - especially those elderly who depend on home care packages, those resident in nursing homes or those needing hospital care. It can also be difficult for those needing consultant's appointments as many of their services operate on skeleton staff which concentrate on emergencies only during July and August.

There is a musical treat coming in early September. The first **Music in Foxrock** event, featuring cellist Ailbhe McDonagh and violinist Lynda O'Connor, will be held in the beautiful surroundings of Lis na Carrig house and garden on 4th and 5th September.

Ailbhe McDonagh is an Irish concert cellist and composer. She performs internationally as a soloist, chamber musician and recording artist, has several studio albums to her name; she is also Professor of Cello at the RIAM.

Lynda O'Connor is one of the greatest Irish violinists of her generation. Showing particularly early promise she made her debut solo performance at the age of four in the National Concert Hall, Dublin, which began her international career as soloist, chamber musician and orchestral leader. Lynda records regularly for film, TV and radio, and has a keen interest in education as a member of the National Concert Hall ECO band.




Tullow Crafty Crew Parish Hall One Thursday a Month






Commemorating 100 Years Since The Amalgamation of the Dublin Metropolitan Police (DMP) With An Garda Síochána (1925 - 2025)



Seeking Families of the Dublin Metropolitan Police



The Dublin Metropolitan Police (DMP) were established in 1836. In 1840, the first officers of the "F" Division arrived at Cumberland Street in Kingstown (now Dún Laoghaire), later moving to 100 Upper George's Street.

This was followed by postings to Booterstown, Blackrock, Dalkey, and finally Kill O' the Grange in 1847.

Over 1,000 DMP members in the Dublin region were integrated in to An Garda Síochána on April 3, 1925, and they continued to play a significant role in local policing until as late as 1967.

To honor their service, a centenary event is planned in Dún Laoghaire later this year.

We are seeking to identify families of former DMP members who served in the Dún Laoghaire region.
