
We also wish every success to those who are moving on to further education or starting work.


### **Music in Foxrock Thursday 4th and Friday 5th September in Lis na Carrig, Brighton Road**

**1 Beckett Green**  
The green space at the corner of Westminster Road and Brighton Road was named in 2014 after Samuel Beckett, Nobel Laureate, who was born near here. At the side of the path you'll see a granite block - this was a seat which used to be at Primrose Cottage (6) when it was the Foxrock Estate Office. A fox's head is engraved on it.

**2 Telephone Box**  
The telephone box in the village is a K1 model, installed in 1926 and is the oldest in the country. Refurbished in 2023, it now hosts a mini library.

**3 A Hotel in Foxrock?**  
Beside what is now the Guinness Gallery, it was built in 1860 and was originally called the Victoria Hotel. By the 1940s, it was no longer a hotel and became a tenement. Thirteen families lived there, they had just one tap in the yard and four outdoor toilets. The building was subsequently demolished and four redbrick houses were built on the site.

**7 Kiltarragh**  
Built in 1905 for Senator Sir Horace Plunkett but was burned down in 1923 during the civil war. Michael Collins, Lady Gregory and George Bernard Shaw were among those entertained there. A rotating bedroom was a feature of the house.

**8 Old Post Office, Westminster Road**  
Now Primrose Cottage. When the first new houses in Foxrock were being built by the Bentley brothers, this was the estate office. Later it became a shop and tea room (Picnic Cottage), a post office in 1870 and a telephone exchange in 1895. The post office moved to Foxrock Village in 1946 but closed some decades later.

**9 The Castle, Claremont Road**  
Originally known as Hollywood Castle, this distinctive house was built in 1816. Its architecture may have originated as 'someone's romantic vision'.

**13 Tullow Church of Ireland**  
Built in 1864 at a cost of £1,600 (£260,000 today). Tullow Church is an attractive building. Its notable parishioners include Nobel Laureate Samuel Beckett who used to attend with his mother, members of the Orpen family and artist Beatrice Elvery (Lady Glenavy). There is a plaque outside to those connected with the parish who died in WW1 & 2, including three Wilson brothers who were killed in WW1, and Sophia Violet Barrett who went down with RMS Lusitania when it was torpedoed in 1918.

**14 Tin Church**  
Before Foxrock Church opened in 1935 a 'tin' church, built in 1906, was on Torquay Road at the corner of The Birches where Ennisconne now stands. It was accessed via rights of way across Foxrock Golf Club and down what is now The Birches. Built of corrugated iron with wooden sheeting inside, there was a main altar and two side altars but no pulpit.

**4 Foxrock Station**  
Imagine being able to hop on a train in Foxrock village! A railway line used to run from Harcourt Street in Dublin to Bray. It opened in 1854 (Foxrock station opened in 1861), closed in 1959 and was known as the 'Slow and Easy'. The station in Foxrock was near the archway to the racetrack and car park. It had three platforms, one of which was used for the special trains which ran on race days at Leopardstown Racecourse. The original ticket office for the racecourse may be seen to the right. Make sure you look at the exhibition about the Harcourt Street Line in the car park.

**5 Leopardstown Racecourse**  
Opened in 1888 when 10 shillings (62c) bought a return train ticket from Harcourt Street and admission to the Grandstand. Racing takes place all year round with about 22 meetings a year.

**6 The Gables**  
Originally built as a grocery shop in 1904 for Findlaters. It closed in 1969 as a grocery shop and opened in 2001 as The Gables restaurant and wine bar.

**10 Kerry Mount Avenue**  
Has many attractive listed, or protected, houses. US President Jimmy Carter's mother stayed in one of them on her way to Dublin in 1877.

**11 Coodliragh**  
A house on the corner of Brighton Road and Kerry Mount Avenue where Samuel Beckett was born in 1906. The house was built for his father William Beckett in 1902-3. Samuel Beckett, who won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1969, is regarded as one of the greatest writers of the 20th century; the characters and landscape of the Foxrock area influenced much of his work.

**12 Gortanore**  
Situated beside 'Thomas' shop, the garden of Gortanore (formerly Fülle) is where a tributary of the river (St. Bride's Stream, also called the Foxrock Stream) which flows through Cabinteely Park, rises. Jane Austen's (*Pride and Prejudice*) grandniece lived here in the 1900s. Its boggy garden was probably the inspiration for Foxrock being called Boghill in Samuel Beckett's play *All That Fall*, which is set in Foxrock.

**15 Foxrock Golf Club, off Torquay Road**  
One of the longest established golf clubs in Ireland, it was originally laid out in 1893 by a Mr. Brown and was redesigned in 1914 by Harry Shepherd Golt, a well-known golf architect.

**16 Scots Pine Trees**  
May be seen all over Foxrock and they are particularly associated with the area. Despite their name, Scots Pines are Ireland's only native pine tree and can live over 250 years. Most of the Scots Pines around Foxrock are well over 100 years old.

**17 Meander**  
On Golf Lane off Westminster Road, designed by the architect Alan Hodgson Hope for his family, was built in 1939 and is regarded as being an important part of the built heritage of south County Dublin. It explores 'Scandinavian modernism' and has a cedar boarded surface finish.

**18 Sink Pipes**  
Are Victorian era stack vents which provided ventilation for sewer pipe networks.

**19 ER Post Box**  
Cast iron post box erected in the Edwardian era 1901 - 1910. ER stands for Edward Rex (King Edward); Rex means king in Latin.

**20 VR Post Box**  
Cast iron post box erected in the Victorian era 1837 - 1901. VR stands for Victoria Regina (Queen Victoria); Regina means queen in Latin.

**Welcome to Foxrock**

In the 17th century 'the eternal strength and lonely grandeur' of the local granite outcrop and 'the velvet mantle of peaty soil, covered with purple heather and golden ferns' described the area.  
Sir William Petty, Down Survey 1654

Before 1860 Foxrock was mainly fields. It started to be developed around 1860 by the Bentley brothers who aimed to create an affluent garden suburb.

An advertisement in *The Irish Times* in 1862 offered building sites for 'mansions and pretty villas'.

The Harcourt Street train line, which opened in 1854 (Foxrock Station opened in 1861), made it an easy commute to Dublin and so Foxrock gradually expanded to become the attractive area it is today.



## Tullow Church on new Heritage Walking Map of Foxrock

A new heritage walking map of Foxrock was launched during Heritage Week in mid August. It shows four different walks around the Foxrock area along with the places of interest along the way. Tullow Church features as do many other places of interest - did you know there used to be a Tin Church on Torquay Road or that there was a hotel in Foxrock Village?

Copies of the map may be had free of charge from the Guinness Gallery, The Gables, Kerb, Grumps, Texaco Centra, Pure Pharmacy and in the old telephone box.

**TOPIC: - SHANKILL IN 1837- PEOPLE, HOUSES AND EVENTS**

In 1837, Shankill, was a rural village. It was part of a larger estate owned by Sir Charles Compton William Donville, who later sought to develop it into a more attractive area for Dublin city residents. At this time, Shankill was primarily characterized by smallholdings and a more rural lifestyle. Donville aimed to transform Shankill by building grand Georgian-style housing, squares, and streets to attract Dublin's wealthier professionals. Rob has spent many years researching this area of Dublin and his wealth of knowledge of this subject will be very informative.
