The Rector Writes

We live in a world driven by consumerism which is fuelled with the promise of finding meaning and happiness in material things. This leads to many chasing the latest trends in homes, cars, clothes, holidays etc. However, for most, this becomes a frustrating and fruitless guest which ultimately ends in disappointment and unhappiness. By contrast, from my conversations with people in their 90's and beyond and asking about their long and full lives and their secret to longevity, they usually respond with the word 'contentment' being happy and thankful for all they have experienced in life, both good and bad. I believe there is a lesson for us all in this as we come to this season of Harvest Thanksgiving when we give thanks for everything that is the product of human and divine effort. St Paul wrote in Philippians 4:11b - 13 'for I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me'. We would do well to follow his example. 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice' (Philippians 4:4).

Music in Foxrock in Tullow Church Friday 24th October at 7.30pm

Join us for an unforgettable evening with the acclaimed pianist John O'Conor and the distinguished composer and concert cellist Ailbhe McDonagh. This performance promises a unique and immersive musical experience.

Ailbhe McDonagh is an Irish concert cellist and composer. She performs internationally as a soloist, chamber musician and recording artist, has several studio albums to her name and is Professor of Cello at the RIAM. She has

composed works for orchestra, chamber music ensembles and has been invited to give masterclasses worldwide.

John O'Conor has long been viewed as one of the greatest pianists of our time. A former Director of the Royal Irish Academy of Music, and a co-founder of the Dublin International Piano Competition, he has been awarded Honorary Doctorates by the National University of Ireland, Trinity College, Dublin Institute of Technology (now TUD) and honoured by the French, Austrian, Japanese, Italian and Polish governments.

The programme includes Beethoven's F major Sonata Op.5, no 1; Fantasiestucke Op. 73; Ailbhe McDonagh's beautiful Skellig and more.

Tullow Friends Make a Difference

Over the last few months Tullow Friends have been busy. They organised a Soup Lunch in the Parish Hall in May and €505 was raised for Mimi Care, Shrewsbury House in Cabinteely. This is a day care centre for people living with dementia and the money was used to create a garden at the centre. Tullow Friends have been planting, watering and weeding to ensure a peaceful oasis for users of the centre.

In June Tullow Friends organised an afternoon tea fundraiser in aid of Purple House, a cancer care charity. The wonderful amount of €1,020 was raised which is a real tribute to the hard work of the organising group, particularly hosts Cleo and Les Ellis, and the generosity of the attendees.

A letter of acknowledgment and thanks from Purple House says that the "donation ensures that families living with cancer can find comfort, hope and practical help when they need it most" and that it enables the team at Purple House "to offer support free of charge so that financial worries never stand in the way of care".

Wholehearted thanks to all who organised and supported these two events.

Tullow Book Club

The Women by Kristin Hannah.

The story is set in USA and in Vietnam covering the Vietnam war and its aftermath.

Frances is determined to make her father proud of her and earn a place on his "hero's wall" in his study.

She studies to become a nurse and eventually gets accepted to go and serve in Vietnam during the war. Two years later, she returns to a very different country to the one she left, with anti-war protests and hostility towards the soldiers and nurses that returned after their tour of duty. Her parents told people that she had gone to Italy for a couple of years, such was the shame of having a member of your family involved in the war.

The book highlights the sacrifices that these young people made by going to serve their country during a time of war, along with the lack of support for nurses and medical staff who suffered post-traumatic stress disorder. Lives continued to be destroyed long after the war was over.

Foxrock and Leopardstown Racecourse. The Harcourt Street railway line can be seen running along the lower edge of the racecourse. The buildings in the middle of the racecourse are the stables and the groundskeeper's house. Leopardstown Hospital is on the right of the photo.

Westminster Road is coming in from the lower left with Torquay Road to the

right and Brighton Road to the left. Foxrock village is at the crossroads and the roof of the garage can be seen as well as the 'hotel' which was where the red brick houses opposite The Gables are now.
