

Winter Fair 29th November

The Winter Fair was one of the highlights of the Tullow year. For weeks and days beforehand the preparations were in full swing - crafts, jams and chutneys being made, cakes baked, posters designed and erected, publicity organised, flyers distributed, raffle prizes, bottles, jewellery, books and bric à brac gathered and sponsorship sought.

The parish hall and the church were hives of activity the day beforehand as the container was emptied and stalls set up. This year bric à brac, party clothes and books were in the church and the feedback was that it worked much better.

Despite heavy rain there was a very good attendance from early on and the teas and coffees were very popular. So many parishioners (and friends) worked so hard beforehand, and on the day, that it was deservedly very good news that €10,000 was raised. This is a wonderful amount and means that the parish's chosen charities - Bray Women's Refuge and Down Syndrome India - will share €1,000 between them.

There are far too many people who deserve thanks to be mentioned individually but Sandra Ruttle who led the organisation of the fair certainly deserves special recognition. Not only did she lead the organisation right down to the smallest detail, she gathered substantial sponsorship for the map which all attendees were given - that sponsorship helped bring the total to €10,000 - she also contributed to the deli stall and helped put up posters!

Service of Remembrance Sunday 23rd November

This time of year is particularly difficult for anyone who has lost a loved one and it can be very emotional as memories flood in. The Service of Remembrance conducted by the Rector at the end of November was beautifully put together with specially chosen readings, prayers and hymns and provided solace for many in the large congregation.

Where possible, relatives of people whose funerals were held in Tullow over the last number of years were contacted and invited to the Service. Many people also came to remember their own relatives and friends who died elsewhere

over the years. All were appreciative that their relatives are still remembered.

Candles were lit for each family group and the dimmed lighting and extra candles in the church all added to the peaceful and poignant, but healing, atmosphere.

Remembrance Sunday Service Sunday 9th November

The Remembrance Sunday Service in Tullow is always a special one, not least because we remember the 17 members/associates of the parish who were killed in both world wars.

As well as remembering those who fell in conflict, new life was also celebrated as the names of babies who were baptised in Tullow in recent years were read out and a candle lit for each of them.
