Register of Vestry Members

Being on the Register of Vestry Members means you can have a say in what goes on in the parish - you can elect people to the Select Vestry, contribute to any debate, vote at the annual Easter General Vestry. You can also, but ONLY if you wish, be nominated or elected to positions such as Church or Glebe Warden or represent the parish at diocesan level. Being a registered vestry member does NOT mean that you will be expected to do more work or contribute more time or money than if you are not registered.

The Register of Vestry Members is revised every January. If you would like to be on the Register there are forms at the back of the church - ask one of the Church Wardens but make sure you do it before the end of January.






Christmas Fair - update

Extract from Minutes of Select Vestry Meeting 21st November

<u>Heating, Lighting, Electrics</u> - the glebe wardens presented a detailed report on options for heating, lighting and electrics. As it is a complex issue with many interdependencies, the Select Vestry members were asked to study the report so it can be discussed in detail and decisions made at the next meeting.

Ramp - easy access ramp is completed. It will be available for use when railings are delivered and disabled parking spaces and walkways are in place. UPDATE - ramp finished in time for the Christmas Fair!

<u>Garden of Remembrance</u> - the working group presented their report on various options regarding maintenance and development of the Garden. This will remain an agenda item until various issues are clarified and decisions taken.

<u>Parish Sustainability Group</u> - the Sustainability Group presented their report and recommended actions. The overall vision for the future is that of the 'Church at the Heart of the Community'. From that vision various targeted actions will flow. The recent consultation process demonstrated that there is strong positivity among parishioners towards the parish; also acceptance and enthusiasm for changes which will be necessary to ensure the parish expands and is relevant to various groups in the community. This process will involve the whole parish.

Changes are already taking place e.g. the Service of the Word on the second Sunday of the month, enhanced website in progress, email edition of the newsletter to name just a few. More to come...

The report was adopted by the Select Vestry and will be presented to the parish in the new year.

Tullow Almost 100 Years Ago - from the minutes of the Tullow Select Vestry

The choir is an important part of our worship particularly at this time of the year but things were done slightly differently nearly 100 years ago!

19 May 1916 - Resignation of paid chorister Miss Joyce Bell. It was agreed to make a renewed effort at strengthening the choir by voluntary assistance.

There was a difficulty however in securing ladies who would attend choir and practices regularly. It was agreed that as a matter of 'patriotism and necessary economy the services of the second chorister be replaced by voluntary help until the end of the war'.

- **27 May 1916** No voluntary help secured but the temporary paid soprano was asked to stay on. She was paid 4/= (4 shillings) (€23) per Sunday for Morning Service.
- **18 January 1918** Still considering the position of paid soprano. Temporary soprano resigned. Salary of paid alto chorister increased to £18pa (€1,100).
- **11 June 1929** Offer received from a 'friend of the church' to pay the salaries of two choristers for five years. Offer gratefully accepted.
- **23 May 1930** New chorister Miss Olive Buchanan of Rathmines appointed at £21pa (€1,504).
- **26 July 1934** Money to pay the choristers nearly exhausted so their services were dispensed with at the end of December.

Select Vestry

In case you ever wondered what the Select Vestry is - twelve parishioners are elected annually at the Easter General Vestry by parish members who are on the General Vestry Register. They, plus the Rector, Glebe and Church Wardens form the Select Vestry. Members are responsible for what are often called the three Fs - finance, furniture and fabric (buildings). This means managing the parish finances, looking after the running of the parish buildings and ensuring compliance with state and church legislation and regulations. Parishioners who are not on the Tullow General Register of Vestry Members, and wish to vote for Select Vestry members, may register before the end of January. Forms are at the back of the church, just ask the Church Wardens.

Many people love settling down with a good book over Christmas so you might like to know that Tullow Book Club will be reading *They Were Sisters* by Dorothy Whipple for their January meeting. It's about three sisters and their choice of husbands and was originally published in 1943.
