Beckett Walks Every Sunday 3.15pm Church Grounds

Organised by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council Heritage Section as part of their Summer of Heritage series, the walks are led by actor Paul O'Hanrahan who is both knowledgeable and highly entertaining. Nobel Laureate Samuel Beckett is an important figure in the history of the area – hear about how the church and so many other places in Foxrock influenced his work. The walk takes about 90 minutes, starts at the church and finishes in the village.

Church Refurbishment Update

Contracts are now ready to be signed for the work to be done on the interior of the church. Except for a few minor details, we have agreed with Johnson Reid, our mechanical and electrical consultants, all the basics necessary to bring the heating, lighting and electrics up to modern standards.

Within the financial constraints that the Select Vestry is comfortable with, we have planned the basics so that at a later date the 'bells & whistles' may be added.

In this context it would be possible - if/when money/donations become available - to introduce for example :

- range of audio visuals with microphone, speakers and drop down screens on either side at front of church
- CCTV which would improve security as well as protection against fraudulent claims
- intruder alarm
- data wiring & Wifi which would enable more flexibility in the use of the building

- Thanks were expressed to all who took part in the Parish Work Day
- Approval given for contracts to be signed by the RCB for the heating, lighting and electrics project. (Note: contracts are in the name of the RCB as owners of the church)
- Following concerns expressed about trees on the boundary with the new nursing home, a review of the planning application took place. All trees are numbered individually and the reviewers felt that they are protected by the planning permission
- In line with the Sustainability Report, which recommended using the church for events, a gospel choir has been booked for November
- Also in line with the Sustainability Report, the position of Parish Development Worker has been advertised
