The Rector Writes

The recent recommendation to government by Dr . Tony Holohan to end mandatory Covid-19 measures has been widely reported in the media. It has also been enthusiastically welcomed by many who have hailed it as the end of Covid-19. Unfortunately, that is not true. What has failed to be properly reported in media headlines is that Covid-19 is still very much with us and will continue to be a serious infection to a sizeable cohort of vulnerable people. And whilst Dr. Holohan has recommended the ending of mandatory measures, he has insisted that such measures will continue to be 'advisory' and will remain strongly urged and recommended in certain settings where people come together - especially indoors. He has also repeatedly stated that compliance with these health measures is to protect others rather than oneself.

Such an indoor setting is our Church building.

And it has been encouraging to see people once again returning to, and engaging in, our Church Services. It is therefore important that we continue to adhere to advised Covid-19 measures in order to keep this space as safe as possible – even for those who may be vulnerable. Coffee after Church has now also resumed, but it is recommended that those who feel vulnerable should continue to avoid attending as, for instance, mask wearing is not possible during this activity.

Elsewhere in this newsletter there are details of events which are planned with the aim to get people to reengage with the many facets of parish life. The past two years have been extremely difficult on everyone and it is important that we now learn to meet up with friends and acquaintances safely. I strongly urge readers to consider how you might support as many of these events as possible, which I hope and



pray they will help us on the path to a happier and more holistic uplifting lifestyle.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday 2nd March. That day will be marked by a Morning celebration of Holy Communion at 10:30am and an Evening Service of the Word at 8:00pm. During Lent an online Bible Study led by Dr. Julie McKinley will be hosted by the National Bible Society of Ireland on Wednesday evenings at 8:00pm commencing on 9thMarch. Tullow Sustainability Group - returning to normality

In April 2019 the Sustainability Group presented its report *The Vision for Tullow 2022* to the Parish (*see image*). Set up by the Select Vestry to look at the need for change in the Parish, an extensive consultation process with 97 households in the Parish led to the final report.

Over the period of the process, and since then, many changes have taken place and many more were planned - and then Covid hit!

As we return to more normal life we would like to encourage parishioners to get involved in Parish life again. Every parish wants to be engaged with its community and, whilst the virtual reach has been very successful, we would really like to see people again in person - in church, involved in Parish activities and enjoying each other's company.

As mentioned elsewhere, there will be a Parish Spring Fair in May which will be organised by the members of the Sustainability Group. Fairs are always great fun, parishioners of all ages get involved and members of the wider community come to Tullow.

Just a reminder of what has been achieved in the Parish since 2018:

- major heating, lighting and electrics project in the church completed
- easy access ramp constructed
- former sexton's house renovated and rented
- traffic barrier installed
- Remembrance Garden renovated

- extensive engagement with wider community
- a number of high profile events including a visit by President Higgins
- online Services during Covid. Services now live-streamed weekly
- email monthly newsletter, growth of Parish email list and frequent email communications, updated website and promotion on Facebook and Instagram
- church doors painted a welcoming colour, floral planters installed

All of the above was achieved with your support so thank you all very much. With the church and grounds in very good repair, we now want to make use of them to sustain and grow our Parish so we ask you to get involved in some of the events planned for the next few months. A couple of them are listed elsewhere and others are in the planning phase.

We will be reaching out to you over the next few weeks and are looking forward to seeing you at some or all of the Parish activities.

Great Sugar Loaf Way

On the way we will have magnificent views across to Glencree Valley and Djouce, and around to Vartry Reservoir and the Little Sugar Loaf.

The Club is for all parishioners and their friends who enjoy social friendship and walking in our beautiful countryside. Details and procedures are as follows:

- Meet in Parish Hall at 12.00 midday (after coffee)
- Share cars if happy to do so
- Wear appropriate warm outdoor clothes including fleece, waterproof jacket, hat and gloves

- Bring small rucksack with a light lunch, i.e., hot drink, sandwich, fruit, bars etc




