

#### Foxrock Station on the Harcourt Street Line 1959

There's so much of interest in this photo - see the gate pillars which are still in place at the entrance to the Foxrock Village car park, the phone box which is the oldest in the country and has been recently refurbished by FACE. The main building is the 'hotel', demolished in the 1970s and replaced by three red brick houses opposite The Gables. Built in the mid 19th century, it only functioned for a short time as a hotel but then became home to 13 families. The present Sherry Fitzgerald office can be seen as well.

The Harcourt Street Line closed in December 1958.

This photo is a taster for a photographic exhibition about the Harcourt Street Line which FACE, in association with the Foxrock Local History Club, will place in Foxrock Village car park later in the summer.

The photo has been donated by the Railway Preservation Society of Ireland, as have many in the exhibition.
