
The Rector Writes

As another school year draws to a close, long summer holidays now lie ahead for all those concerned. For those who have just completed their Leaving Certificate Examinations, the seemingly endless anxious wait ahead of results in mid-August begins. Hopefully this will bring clarity to candidates' future direction and enable them to realise their hopes and dreams. As our Primary Schools close for the summer, those in sixth class will now be looking forward to moving to their Secondary school of choice in late August. It can be both an anxious and exciting time for students and families alike.

However, for most, summer is a time when they look forward to being able to take things a little easier and plan a holiday – a break away from routine. Whilst that is both welcome and necessary, it can be a difficult time for those who depend on routine -

especially those elderly depending on home care packages, those in Nursing Homes and those needing hospital care. It can also be difficult for those awaiting consultant's appointments as many such services operate on an emergency basis only.

Lifestyle Medicine

Making sustainable lifestyle changes has the potential to prevent 80% of chronic diseases (e.g. cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancers), increase longevity and improve the quality of life at all ages - most importantly, it gives individuals autonomy over their own health.

Dr Gillian Dagg is a qualified General Practitioner, Lifestyle Medicine Physician and Tiny Habits Coach, she is passionate about this area of medicine and is determined to empower people to change their own health trajectory.

Organised by FACE, Gillian has given a very interesting series of talks in Foxrock Golf Club. Those talks will be repeated in the evenings in the autumn.

Tips about Sleep

Gillian's most recent talk was at the end of June and was about the importance of sleep. She gave a lot of information and advice about how to get a good night's sleep. Here are just some of her tips:

Enhance Your Body Clock

- have a consistent wake up time
- take exercise in the morning, avoid evening exercise
- don't eat too late
- avoid screens before bed

Get Yourself Feeling Sleepy

- avoid long naps, caffeine after lunch, alcohol

Bring Calmness to Your Body and Mind

- try meditation, deep breathing and a wind down routine
- have a 'Done' list rather than a to do list
- avoid working at night, screens, watching the news, checking phone in bed, noise

Alcohol Affects Sleep

High amounts of alcohol decrease sleep quality by nearly 40%
